

## Foreword to the Teacher

Jesus Comes is intended to serve as the Grade Two text of Our Holy Faith. The pupil's text does not contain everything that is covered in a course of study, but chooses certain important topics and highlights them for the child.

Since **Jesus Comes** has twenty-four lessons, approximately one period per week should be given over to its study. The remaining days can be used to develop, drill, and cover the other topics in the complete course of study.

The lessons in **Jesus Comes** should be taken up only after the topic has been studied as outlined in the **Teacher's Manual and Course of Study.** With such preparation, the lessons in **Jesus Comes** will be relatively easy and enjoyable. Without it they may be difficult for the slower pupils.





I will use my tongue to praise You and to speak kindly of others.





God punished Adam and Eve for their sin.


Adam and Eve were no longer God's adopted children, and they lost many gifts God had given them.




Then God gave Moses work to do for Him.

# The Obedience of the Holy Family


One day God kept His great promise to send His Son.


A wonderful thing happened to the Blessed Virgin Mary.

Saint Joseph is the foster father of Jesus.

Jesus loved His Father in heaven. He always obeyed His Father and loved His Mother Mary.

He loved Saint Joseph, His foster father. Jesus always obeyed Mary and Joseph.

Our family also pleases God when we obey Him as the Holy Family did.

The Holy Family lived in Nazareth.

Jesus stayed at His home in Nazareth until He was about thirty years old.

Then Jesus began to do the work which His Father had given Him to do.

His work was to teach. He was to save all people. He was to lead them to heaven.

Day after day Jesus went around doing good. Jesus healed sick people.





# Unit III. How We Should Obey God

- 2. Thou shalt not take the name of the Lord thy God in vain.
- 3. Remember thou keep holy the Lord's day.
  - 4. Honor thy father and thy mother.
  - 5. Thou shalt not kill.
  - 6. Thou shalt not commit adultery.
  - 7. Thou shalt not steal.
  - 8. Thou shalt not bear false witness against thy neighbor.
  - 9. Thou shalt not covet thy neighbor's wife.
- 10. Thou shalt not covet thy neighbor's goods.

We must all obey these ten laws of God. When I obey these laws I show God that I love Him.

God made me for heaven.

I want to be happy forever with God in heaven. These ten laws of God will help me get to heaven. They show me the way.

The first law of God tells me that I must love God above all things.

## I love God:

when I say my morning and night prayers every day.

when I go to Mass.

when I think of Him during the day.

when I tell Him how sorry I am that I disobeyed Him.

when I ask God to forgive my sins.

when I ask God for His help.

when I thank God for everything that He has given me.

when I love my brothers and sisters.

when I obey my parents.

## I break God's first law:

if I miss my morning or night prayers for a long time.

if I purposely think of other things while praying.

if I attend vacation school at a church which is not Catholic.

if I love myself more than God.

- I honor God's name when I say the Divine Praises.



- 3. By doing good works such as:
  Helping mother at home.
  Making people happy.
  Visiting my sick friends.

I will go to Mass every Sunday and holyday.

I will never miss Holy Mass on Sundays or holydays unless I have a very good reason.

On Sunday I will come to Holy Mass on time.

I will use my prayer book or my rosary.

I will not talk or look around in God's House.

I will stay for the whole Mass.

God is kind to me.

He does not want me to work all the time.

God wants Sunday to be a day of rest.

God forbids me to do all unnecessary work on that day.

How kind God is to give me a day for prayer, rest, and play.

I will try to do as Jesus did.

I please God when I obey my parents at once.



God gave me all the things I have.

God gave me my parents.

I please God when I am happy with the things that He has given me.

I will thank God every day for all His wonderful gifts to me.





# The Sacrament of Baptism

God gave the Church seven helps to make and keep me holy.

These seven helps are called the Seven Sacraments.

Baptism is the first of these helps. It takes away original sin and makes me a child of God and a member of His Church.

Penance takes away my sins and gives me grace to do good.

Holy Eucharist gives me Jesus as the Food of my soul.

Confirmation brings the Holy Spirit to me and makes me a soldier of Jesus Christ.

Holy Orders makes a man a priest of God.

Matrimony makes a man and woman husband and wife and brings them closer to Christ.

Extreme Unction gives me God's grace when I am in danger of death.



I came into this world with the sin of Adam. This sin in me is called original sin.

I was not pleasing to God because of this sin. When I was baptized original sin was taken away.

I became a child of God.

God came to live in me, giving me a share in His life.

This life of God in me is called grace.

ther Almighty, Creator of heaven

CHILDREN: I do believe.

Priest: Do you believe in Jesus Christ,

His only Son, our Lord, who was born, and who suffered for us?

CHILDREN: I do believe.

Priest: Do you also believe in the Holy

Ghost, the Holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body and life everlasting?

CHILDREN: I do believe.

Priest: Now stand and say the Apostles'

Creed.

Priest: Kneel and say the Our Father.



### Sin

When I break God's law I commit a sin. Any sin that I commit is called an actual sin. There are two kinds of actual sin:

- 1. Mortal sin, a great offense against God.
- 2. Venial sin, a lesser evil.

Mortal sin makes me an enemy of God and takes His life away from me.

If I die with a mortal sin I will go to hell forever.

Missing Holy Mass through my own fault on Sunday is a mortal sin. Eating meat when I know it is Friday would be a mortal sin. Venial sin is not as bad as mortal sin.

But venial sin offends God too.

Venial sin weakens God's life in me.

Stealing a dime, or telling a little lie, or disobeying my teachers in itself would be a venial sin.

God hates all sin.

I must hate all sin.

God always knows when I commit a sin and will punish me if I am not sorry.

God loves me when I do not commit sin.

I will ask God to help me keep away from all sin.

God will help me do this.



It was the power to forgive our sins.

Jesus gave this power to His Apostles.

They were His first priests.

Through the Apostles Jesus gives this power to all priests.

In the sacrament of Penance the priest uses this power.

In the sacrament of Penance I tell my sins to the priest.

My sins are forgiven by the priest, if I am sorry for them.

Jesus is God.

Jesus knows all I think.

Jesus knows all I do.

Jesus knows all I say.

I cannot keep a secret from Jesus.

Jesus knows when I sin.

Jesus knows when I am sorry for my sins.

Jesus will not forgive my sins if I do not tell all my big sins to the priest in confession.

I will try my best not to displease our Lord by my sins.

In confession the priest uses the power Jesus gives him.

I must never be afraid to tell my sins to the priest.

I will listen to everything the priest says.

He will be kind to me and help me.

The priest will keep my sins a secret.

When I tell my sins to the priest in confession I am really telling them to Jesus.

Through the priest, Jesus forgives me my sins. The sins are then gone from my soul.

I will do or say the penance that the priest gives me.

- Jesus was very kind to me when He gave His priests this great power to forgive me my sins.
- I can never thank Jesus enough for this gift of the sacrament of Penance.
- I must remember to pray for the priest who takes my sins away.





Unit V. How God Cares for Our Souls Through the Holy Eucharist

### The Holy Eucharist

One day when Jesus was at a wedding He changed water into wine.

Another time He fed a crowd of hungry people.

He gave them food for their bodies.

On another day, He promised them food for their souls.

Jesus said to the people, "I am the living bread that has come down from heaven."

Jesus kept this promise when He gave us the sacrament of Holy Eucharist.

Jesus gave us this sacrament at the Last Supper, the night before He died.

The Holy Eucharist is the living Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus Christ.

The priest changes bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Jesus at Mass.

The Holy Eucharist looks like bread.

The Holy Eucharist tastes like bread.

But the Holy Eucharist is not bread.

The Holy Eucharist is Jesus.

Jesus gives Himself to me in the Holy Eucharist.

Jesus is the Food of my soul.

### The Mass

At the Last Supper Jesus offered the first Mass. The Apostles were with Jesus when He said the first Mass.

Jesus took bread in His hands and said, "This is My Body."

Jesus took a cup of wine and said, "This is My Blood."

At once the bread and wine became the real living Body and Blood of Jesus.

Then Jesus gave His Body to His Apostles to eat, and His Blood to drink.

When Jesus said to the Apostles, "Do this in remembrance of Me," He made them His first priests.

He gave them the power to offer Mass.

The Apostles and all the priests of the Catholic Church have used this power ever since.

The priests do as Jesus did at the Last Supper.

They do this when they offer Mass.

Jesus offered Himself to His heavenly Father.

He gave His life for us on the cross.

The Mass is the same sacrifice as that of the cross.

ON THE CROSS: Jesus, true High Priest, offered Himself to God the Father.

AT MASS: Jesus offers Himself to God the Father through

the priest.

ON THE CROSS: Jesus was the Victim.

AT MASS: Jesus is the Victim.

ON THE CROSS: Jesus gave His life for all

people.

AT MASS: The life of Jesus is again

offered for all people.

During Mass I can offer many gifts to God. God gives many gifts to me.

At the OFFERTORY the priest offers the bread and wine to God.

At the Offertory I must offer myself to God. I offer God my love, prayers, work, and play. I want to give God all that I am and all that I have.





The CONSECRATION is the holiest part of the Mass.

At the Consecration of the Mass, the priest says, "This is My Body."

This changes the bread into Jesus.

He says: "This is My Blood."

This changes the wine into His Blood.

Jesus offers Himself to God for us.

I cannot see Jesus but I know He is there.

The priest raises the Sacred Host and the Chalice above his head.

I look up and say, "My Lord and my God."



At the COMMUNION of the Mass God has a Gift for me.

This Gift is Jesus in Holy Communion.

The priest receives Jesus in Holy Communion.

I receive Jesus in Holy Communion.

I receive Him for the first time on my First Communion Day.

Jesus will come to me in Holy Communion every day if I want Him.



  - 1. To adore God.
  - 2. To thank God.
  - 3. To ask God for what we need.
  - 4. To tell God we are sorry for our sins.
- \*137. Must we be present for the whole Mass on Sundays and holydays of obligation? Yes, we must be present for the whole Mass on Sundays and holydays of obligation. We commit a mortal sin if through our own fault we are not present for the three principal parts of the Mass.
- \*138. What are the three principal parts of the Mass?

The three principal parts of the Mass are:

- 1. The Offertory.
- 2. The Consecration.
- 3. The Communion.



### Holy Communion

Jesus loves me.

Jesus wants to come to me often in Holy Communion.

I must get ready for Jesus to come to me.

- I am ready when I am God's friend and have His life in me.
- I am ready when I tell Jesus I am sorry for my sins.
- I am ready when I tell Jesus that I love Him and want Him to come to me.
- I am ready when I do not eat anything for three hours or drink anything but water for one hour before receiving Communion.

When Jesus comes to me I will thank Him.

- I will tell Him how happy I am that He is with me.
- I will tell Him that I believe He is both God and man.
- I will tell Him that I love Him.
- I will tell Him that I hope to live with Him in heaven some day.
- I will ask Him to bless and help everyone on earth and in purgatory.
- I will ask Him to love me and stay with me always.

### QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

\*139. What is Holy Communion?

Holy Communion is the receiving of our Lord's Body and Blood.

140. Do you see Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist? (51)

No, I do not see Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist because He is hidden under the appearances of bread and wine.

\*141. What must you do to receive Holy Communion? (52)

To receive Holy Communion I must:

- 1. Have my soul free from mortal sin.
- 2. Not eat anything for three hours before Holy Communion or drink anything for one hour. But water may be taken at any time before Holy Communion.
- 142. What should you do before Holy Communion? (53)

Before Holy Communion I should:

- 1. Think of Jesus.
- 2. Say the prayers I have learned.
- 3. Ask Jesus to come to me.

After Holy Communion I should:

- 1. Thank Jesus for coming to me.
- 2. Tell Him how much I love Him.
- 3. Ask Him to help me.
